

## Job Criteria

### Lead Construction Specialist – MIA (Miami Airport)

The Lead Construction Specialist (LCS) operates in a supervisory capacity as outlined in paragraph 4.1 of the Memorandum of Agreement. It is recognized that the primary responsibilities are supervisory duties which may occupy virtually all of his/her time. The LCS is not required or expected to use tools. However; in emergency situations when the LCS is the first responder due to airport security access he/she may perform emergency switching.


Supervises an underground crew(s) engaged in the construction and maintenance of structures above and below ground, including vaults, manholes, ducts, and jobs requiring skilled Craftworker labor in the installation and construction of electrical equipment, also include installing and terminating cable in URD systems.

Will be responsible for performance of assigned work in accordance with all company design standards and work methods, and be expected to prepare all associated paperwork. The LCS can be required to work extended hours.

#### Minimum requirements for job:

- 1) Must be able to obtain and maintain any required airport security clearances.
- 2) Must be physically able to do all assigned tasks.
- 3) Must be able to work in direct sunlight or at night.
- 4) Must be able to obtain a valid CDL.
